


# **Welcoming Prep Parents**

### Value of the Month: Empathy

#### A Chain of Empathy in Our School

Students took part in an activity called **Building Bridges of Empathy**. Each student wrote on a strip of colourful paper, a thought or reflection about empathy using prompts like, "I can show empathy by..." or "One act of kindness I can do this week is...". Their paper strips were linked together to form a chain, symbolising connection and understanding.

These empathy chains, create a visual reminder of the importance of kindness and support in our school community.



Year 3 & 4 Prep students had a great time meeting Ms. Kansal and playing a game of bingo designed to help them identify different types of emotions. This activity provided a creative way for students to explore their feelings and learn how to express their emotions.
