Top Tips - Hear From Our Staff Experts

Here are some top tips from Mr. Fernandes to improve academic success by encouraging healthy routines:

Tip 1 - Establish a Homework Routine: Encourage your child to complete homework at the same time every day in a quiet, distraction-free space. Consistency builds focus and reduces stress.

Tip 2 - Promote a Balanced Sleep Schedule: Ensure your child gets enough rest. Research suggests that children aged 11-16 need 8-10 hours of sleep to perform at their best.

Tip 3 - Encourage Active Breaks: Physical activity, even for 15 minutes, can boost mood, concentration, and overall academic performance. Activities such as walking, jogging, skipping, or simple stretches can help release tension and improve blood flow to the brain. These active breaks enhance focus, reduce stress, and help students return to their studies feeling more refreshed and productive. For additional variety, encourage your child to try activities like yoga, dancing, or a 15-30 minute HIIT workout on YouTube. Regular exercise has been shown to improve memory and cognitive functions, making it a key ingredient for academic success.


