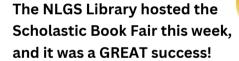








Scholastic Book Fair 2025

Top Tips - Hear From Our Staff Experts

With exams approaching after the half-term, now is the ideal time for students to refine their revision strategies and make the most of their study time. *The Pomodoro Technique* is a proven method to boost focus and productivity during exam preparation. **Mrs Erdil** shares her three top tips to help your child use this technique effectively, stay motivated, and reduce exam stress.

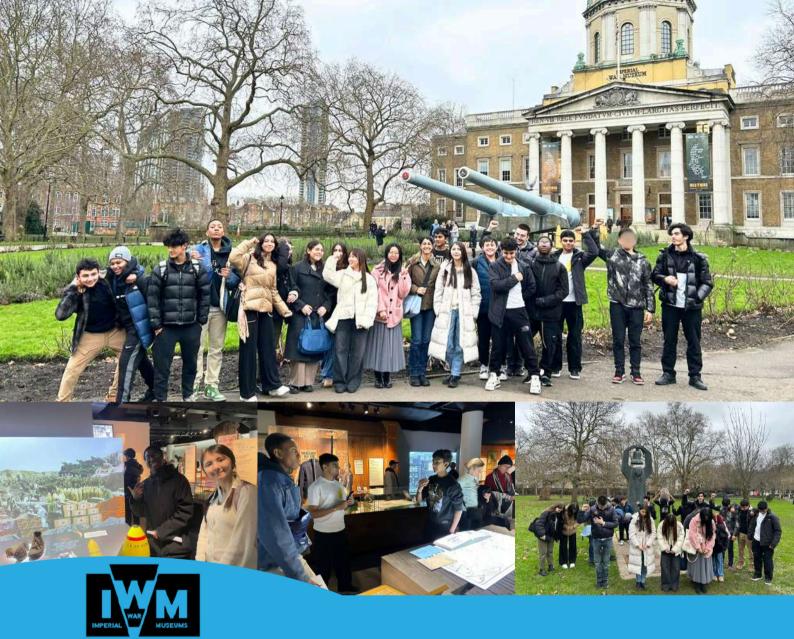
Create a Distraction-Free Environment - Create a quiet, organised study space, free from distractions like phones or TV. During each 25-minute session, students should focus entirely on revision. Support them by minimising interruptions and keeping them on track.

Use a Timer and Stick to the Schedule - *The Pomodoro Technique* uses 25-minute study sessions, followed by 5-minute breaks. After four sessions, take a longer break (15-30 minutes). Use a timer to maintain this structure, building discipline and preventing burnout.

Encourage Active Breaks - Use the 5-minute breaks for refreshing the mind like stretching, a healthy snack, or a quick walk. Avoid screens to maintain focus. After the longer break, they'll return to revision feeling re-energised.

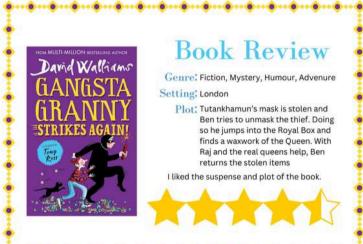
